Julia Dench's Saga

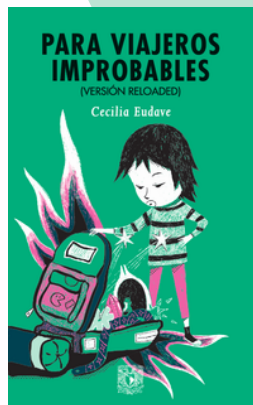
